Center co-authors policy briefs addressing aspects of REDD policy

The push towards obtaining an agreement on an international mechanism for reducing emissions from deforestation and forest degradation (REDD) continues this October with negotiations under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in Bangkok, Thailand. In order to facilitate discussions with both Party negotiators and civil society, the WHRC, together with partners Amazon Environmental Research Institute, Conservation International, Environmental Defense Fund, and The Nature Conservancy, produced five policy briefs on aspects of REDD policy. These briefs describe our shared positions on the scope, scale, and financing arrangements of an international REDD framework, as well as on the critical issues of the participation and rights of Indigenous Peoples and forest-dependent communities and the potential ecological co-benefits of REDD activities.
